Transplant Québec marks its first full year of coordinating the transportation of organs by ground

Montreal, October 17, 2025 – On the occasion of World Organ Donation and Transplant Day, Transplant Québec marks its first year of coordinating the ground transport of organs on a Quebec-wide scale, in collaboration with province's police forces.

This system, the only one of its kind in Canada, was first established in 1987. Each year, it ensures the transport of several hundred organs. While it has been in place for almost four decades, its coordination was entrusted to Transplant Québec in 2024, marking an important milestone on the road to optimizing the organ donation and transplantation process.

For the past 38 years in Quebec, vehicles transporting organs have been driven by police officers volunteering their time in support of the cause. "A total of 764 organs were transported by land in 2024. Between 1987 and 2024, about 44,000 volunteer hours were dedicated to emergency transport, accounting for more than two and a half million kilometres travelled. That's incredibly impressive, and it's unique to Canada. In other jurisdictions, organs are transported by taxi or by ambulance. We're extremely proud of this groundbreaking collaboration," said Martine Bouchard, President and Executive Director of Transplant Québec.

One of Transplant Québec's objectives is to improve the efficiency and flow of the organ donation process in Quebec. "Obviously, we were prepared to shoulder the added responsibilities that go along with acquiring 11 organ transport vehicles. Entrusting our organization with these responsibilities, with the collaboration of our partners, marks a further step toward saving more lives in Quebec and becoming an international model for organ donation and transplantation," said Martine Bouchard. She added: "Strong leadership and rigorous coordination are essential to ensure efficiency across Quebec's organ donation and transplantation system."
